Change map (by council region)

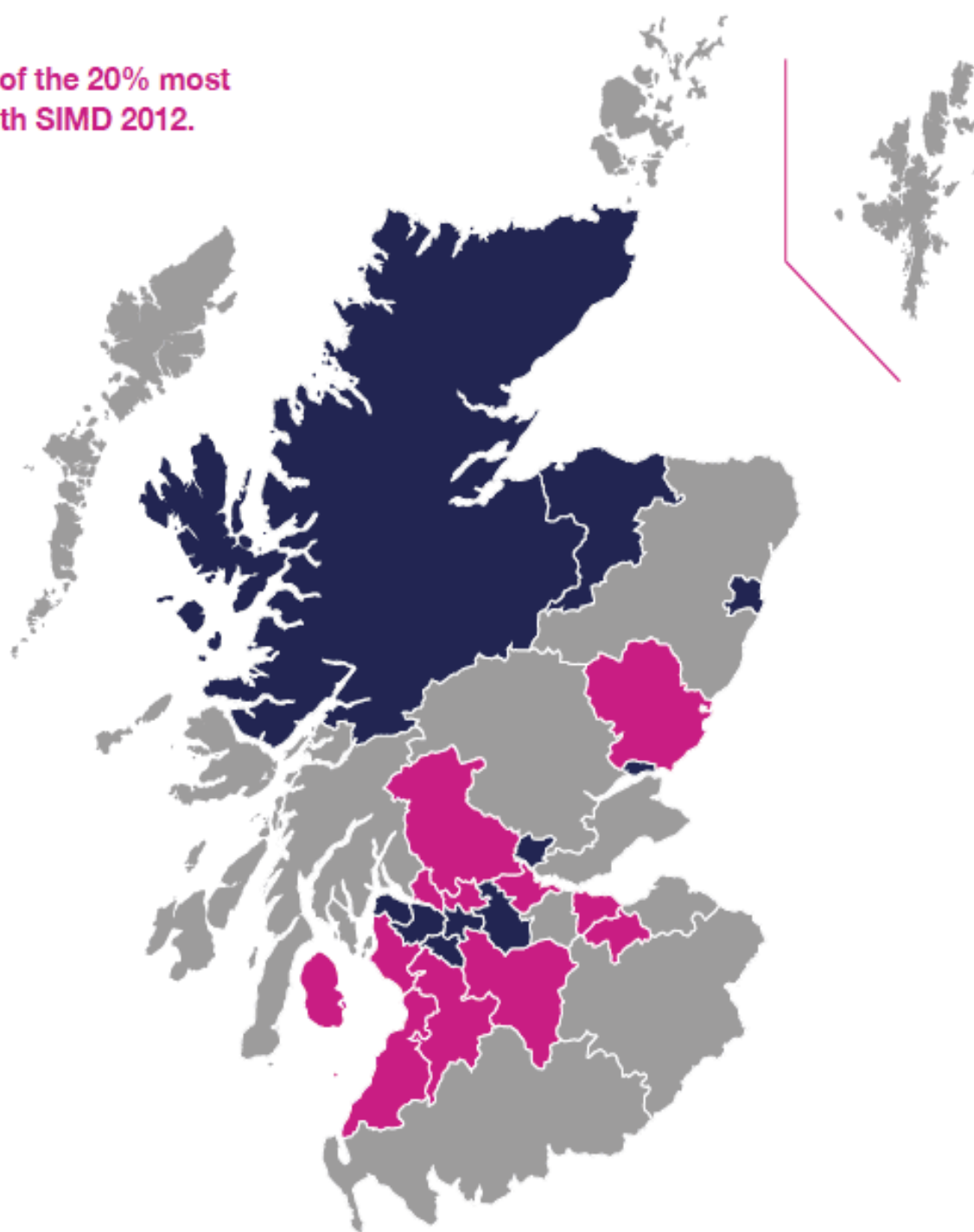
- Decrease in Deprivation

Council areas with the largest increase:

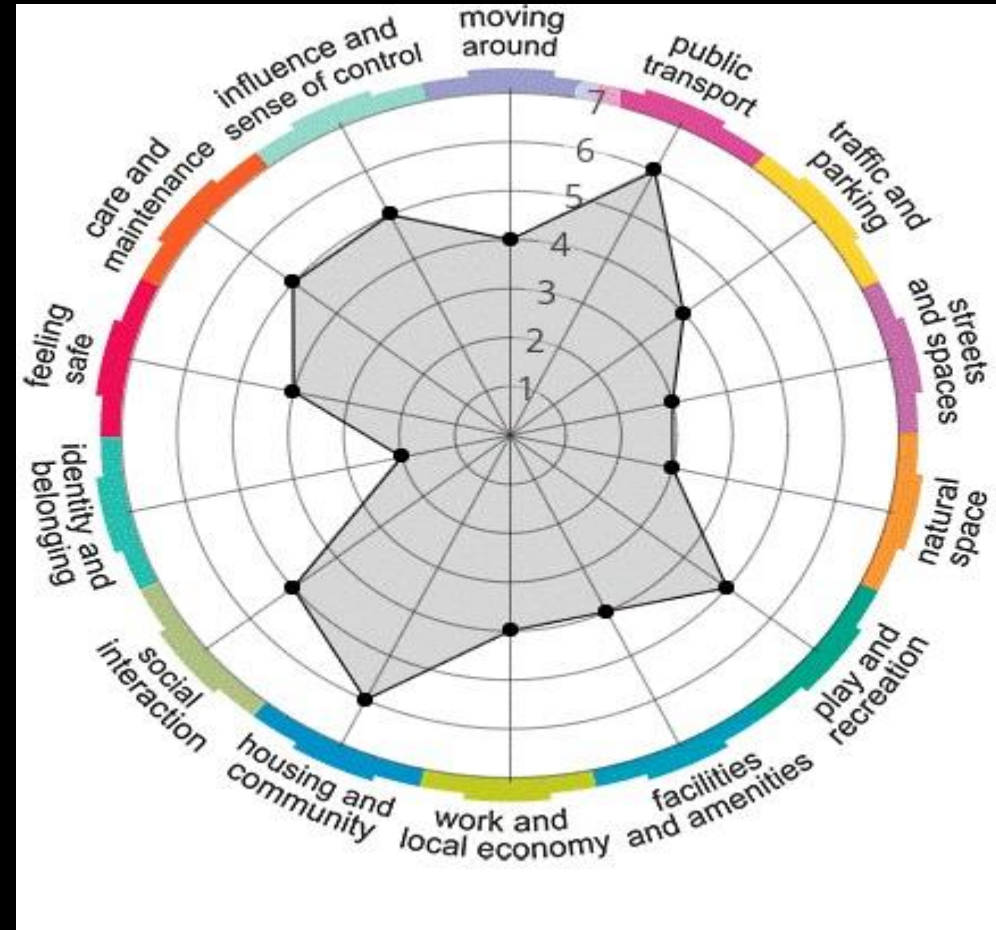

Trauma Aware and Informed Environments

‘A healthy psychological informed environment must be offered and maintained to provide a mutually beneficial and growth producing experience. This includes safety, trust, appreciation, respect, autonomy, care and an emphasis on giving the ‘individual’ a voice. Creating a safe space for engagement that’s warm, aired, with a window and comfortable seating is often forgotten detail in support work. Without these small details, the climate could act as a trigger that could aggravate people’s unresolved traumas’.
