Deprivation in Scottish Cities



Blue areas are amongst the 20% least deprived in Scotland


Red areas are amongst the 20% most deprived in Scotland





Vulnerable Children and Young People Population in Glasgow

- **38,000 (50%):** depend on benefits
- **25,000 (34%):** on staged intervention model
- **10,000 (15%):** supported by social work
- **7,500 (10%):** affected by parents' drug misuse
- **10,000 (13%):** affected by parental alcohol misuse
- **9,000 (12%):** affected by domestic abuse

Children's learning - how do Glasgow's schools measure up?

In 2014 **65,516** pupils attended Glasgow City Council schools



38,496 primary pupils

25,374 secondary pupils



1,646 pupils were enrolled at schools providing additional support for learning



18% of primary pupils and 16% of secondary pupils were recorded as having English as an Additional Language.

30% of primary pupils and 25% of secondary pupils were entitled to free school meals.



School attainment levels in the city's schools have been rising steadily over the last ten years.

89% of school leavers now go on to higher education, further education, employment, training or voluntary work.

- Year on year improvement for the past 10 years
- Relentless focus on attendance, exclusions, high quality teaching and learning, increased flexible options and whole school approaches to support improvement
- Understanding and use of data




