
### Community Action and Placemaking Plans

- Takes priorities set by people and turns local knowledge into planning policy
- Puts the community at the start of the planning process
- Represents democratically agreed priorities
- Gives equal merit to local priorities identified with other aspects of planning policy
- Ownership of the final Plans are with the local community.
- Community members understand better their role in the planning process
- Communities shift from being reactive to proactive
- A single process improving efficiency and reducing consultation fatigue
- Has prompted the use of the Place Standard Tool as part of process












**Placemaking Process Flowchart** 












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#### **Draft Newmilns and Greenholm Action Program**

Cycling and walking route improvements - Improvements to infrastructure which encourage people to walk and cycle more.

- Improve paths and closes in the town centre
- Investigate improving the safety and accessibility of local walking routes particularly Jacobs Ladder

Streetscape improvements - Measures which help people move around more easily, reduce negative experiences and enhance positive experiences.

- Improve the safety of pedestrians and cyclists on main traffic routes
- Improve the interpretation, signage and linkages through the village for the Irvine Valley Trail, recreation and heritage sites
- Provide cycling racks in the town centre
- Investigate the removal cobbled area in the town centre to improve mobility access
- Develop a heritage lighting scheme based on historical pictures of The Cross
- Investigate restricting parking on Bridgend at the junction with Main Street
- Provide more welcoming street furniture
- Re-establishment of traditional close names

Opportunities for civic space improvements - Areas of vacant or underutilised space such as squares, parkland, local landmarks or natural features to be improved for public use or visual amenity improvement.

- Investigate additional car parking at the ski slope
- Investigate additional car parking at 4 6 Browns Rd
- Improve car parking at Gillfoot recreation ground
- Investigate additional car parking at Murdoch Nesbit Court
- Improvements to the riverbank bank area adjacent to Nelson Street

Green space requiring improvement - Improvements to areas of grassland or woodland to improve opportunities for play, recreation or visual amenity.

- Investigate improvements to the running track at Gillfoot
- Investigate green area to the rear of the primary school for recreational activities
- Improved parkland adjacent to Darvel Road

Priority buildings - Buildings which require significant regeneration in order to improve their impact on the quality of the built environment.

Investigate improvements the following buildings

Potential development sites - Brownfield sites not already identified for development which impact negatively on the visual amenity but may offer opportunities for improvement.

Investigate improvements the following sites

- Site at rear of the Crown Hotel 152 / 154 Main Street
- 126 Main Street
- Sire adjacent to 33/35 Brown Street.
- Site East of Jacobs Ladder

Protection and enhancement of historic core - Buildings, ruins, remains or features of landscape which are historically notable or significant for which improvements to protect or enhance are to be developed.

- Town House, 50 Main Street
- Morton Hall, Main Street
- Viaduct
- General improvement of façades in keeping with the heritage aspects of the village within the streetscape improvement area.


Housing development / improvement opportunities - Brownfield or green-field sites where future new-build housing could be developed or areas of existing housing where the condition of the properties leads to significant consistent vacancies and negative visual impact.

PRIORITY 1	Derelict buildings List all derelict buildings that require action Agree on priorities – e.g. those in the High Street/Loudoun Road/Main Street Work with East Ayrshire Council to put pressure on owners to improve buildings Look at potential to take some buildings into community ownership if there is a use for them e.g. Co-op building
NRA will liaise with	Community council, East Ayrshire Council, Private Landlords, Relevant voluntary groups, Loudoun Valley Trust

#### **Village Appearance**

#### Care and maintenance

- Are public areas, facilities and properties well maintained?
- Are there any specific problems in the area, such as litter, vandalism or dog fouling?
- Are there good facilities for refuse storage and collection? Are recycling facilities available and easily accessed?
- Do local authorities, housing associations, landlords and residents all know their roles and responsibilities? Is action taken when necessary?
- •Is communication clear and effective? Residents should be kept informed of any changes to services and be able to easily report problems of they arise.
- •Is there a local residents association? Is it effective?

#### Streets and spaces

- •Is being in or passing this place a pleasant experience?
- Are there positive features such as local landmarks, historic building, public squares or natural features that make the place feel distinctive?
- Are there distinctive features and routes that help you to find you way around?
- Do buildings, features and public spaces look interesting and attractive?
- Are there negative features such as derelict buildings, vacant land and excessive noise? Does the design of the area help to lessen their impact?
- •Is the experience of the place positive both day and night in different seasons or weather conditions?
