Understanding Capacity, Consent and Protection from abuse

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Background

- Ms A came to the attention of Social Work Services in 2006, when the independent provider supporting her, advised her funds were depleted and she required assistance to continue with support.
- Ms A was a 60 year old woman who had a learning disability and was supported by her parent's until their death in 1991, a financial guardian subsequently took over this responsibility. The order was rescinded in 2008.
- Ms A had an on off relationship with Mr B who also had a learning disability and was supported by SLC.
- 2014 Mr B was found unfit to plead to causing the death of Ms A and is currently detained at the State Hospital.

'Adult at Risk of Harm'

Adults aged 16 years and over, who -

- are unable to safeguard their own well-being, property, rights or other interests, and
- are at risk of harm, and
- because they are affected by disability, mental disorder, illness or physical or mental infirmity, are more vulnerable to being harmed than adults who are not so affected

Adults With Incapacity (Scotland) Act

- Adults over 16
- 2 part test

2)By reason of

➤ Mental Disorder (Mental Illness, Personality Disorder, Learning Disability)

Inability to communicate (which cannot be remedied) because of physical disability

Capacity / Consent

Does the person understand what happening to them

Understand the implications and consequences

Communicate their decision.

Exercise choice and control

Capacity Assessments

Talk to the person, their views and wishes

Multi professional approach

All available and relevant information

Include those who know the individual

Take into account communicate skills

Key Recommendations

- Ensure full understanding and compliance with ASP Procedures, recognise, refer and progress timiously
- Staff / managers training in understanding and management of both capacity and risk assessments
- Where abuse or violence present notify Police Scotland
- Formal risk/ capacity assessments to inform planning
- Recording (decisions taken-not taken) defensible decision making
- Review commissioning services / arrangements
