- Body of Housing legislation, 1987 & 2001 Acts, most recently updated by Housing (Scotland) Act 2014
- 'Representation' of reasonable preference
- (Expanded) underoccupancy requirement
- New options/provisions around heritable property
 (OO)
- Duty to consult etc.




Fundamental principles

Remain....

- Open and fair access to the housing list
- Prioritisation focused on addressing housing need (as broadly defined by legislation) (TBC)
- Best use, incl. in relation to size, design
- Range of 'no goes': income, length of residency
- Transparency whilst respecting confidentiality
- Compliant, incl. answerable to SHR

Reasonable preference

- Reasonable Preference (RP) = must be given appropriate priority
- Applies to existing (transfer) or new (general needs, waiting) applicants
- Range of RP groups, incl. health or disability (as unsatisfactory housing)
- Relative priority to each RP group driven by profile of housing need
- Needs that 'cannot otherwise be met'
- Profile of offers/lets driven by needs vs. available lets (location, size, design, accessibility)



Range of competing/overlapping needs

- Homeless persons and threatened with homelessness
 - Rapid Rehousing, (lesser extent) Housing First
 - Development of Rapid Rehousing Transition Plans
 - Potential to dominate; some areas, for some time
 - Pressure on 1 and 2 bed stock
- People from range of other housing need groups, e.g.
 - Extreme overcrowding, under occupying
 - Young care leavers
 - Domestic abuse
- Potential for multiple needs (building relative priority within general/transfer)



The case for addressing need via SRS

- Commonality across needs: security, quality, levels of service, affordability
- Focus on fuel poverty etc (incl. Energy Efficiency Standard for Social Housing (EESSH) agenda etc)
- Wider public 'good'/resource management case
- Health & disability specific: key part of 'package'
- Including addressing mental health
- Effective/timely delivery of health & social care services
- Not exclusive, but clear added value



LLIs – what's the potential?

- Must be published
- Be supported by evidence as to why they are required, have clear outcomes
- Apply to a specific geographical area, be time limited
- Consultation is required (key partners, incl. current applicant and tenants)

MUST COMPLY WITH LEGISLATION

- In addition to, <u>not instead of</u>, application of AP, cannot override focus on housing need
- But....could be (health/medical need) thematic?
- If the case can be made?
- Not about addressing a 'misfiring' across the whole policy
