- Full NSPCC presence (direct services and policy/research functions) since 2011.

 - Early intervention and prevention.
 - Evidence; evaluating & delivering services to inform wider system change.
- Glasgow Service Centre delivers a cohesive set of services which all have infant mental health / attachment / parent-child relationships at their core.

The Scottish Policy Context


- Our work compliments the substantial body of existing Scottish Government policy & guidance
- Emphasises the fundamental importance of children's earliest experiences in building the foundations for life
- Enhances the GIRFEC approach to child wellbeing by helping to create a shared narrative around early child development.

Links to the commitments in the recent programme for government around:

- Increasing investment for infant mental health and perinatal mental health.
- Preventing and reducing the negative impact of ACEs
- Supporting resilience in families

Together for Childhood - Govan

- A place based, long term, partnership project to prevent abuse and neglect.
- Every local community is different
- Rooted in an understanding that young children's wellbeing relies entirely on the relationships around them.
- Create a powerful partnership with local people and agencies to transform how the community of Govan raises its children.
- Together for Childhood site is specially run by a local team.
- Working with the community, the partners look at what's working well, how organisations are working together and what can be done to build on that.
- Then, together, we test new ways to prevent abuse that are tailor-made for the community's needs.



The Need


 27% of all children in Govan are living in poverty

Therapeutic Interventions

- We provide therapeutic services to help children move on from abuse, as well as supporting parents and families in caring for their children.
- We help professionals make the best decisions for children and young people, and support communities to help prevent abuse from happening in the first place
- Our Scale-up Unit works with other organisations to help them <u>deliver and test our programmes</u> locally and sharing what really works, to help even more children and families

Glasgow Infant and Family Team (GIFT)

Set up to deliver the New Orleans intervention

Hosted by NSPCC in a *partnership* between Glasgow City Council, NHSGCC, Glasgow University and NSPCC

Social workers, Psychologists, child psychiatrist, 1 co-ordinator, 2 assistants

Works with birth families, foster carers and wider system

Offers evidenced recommendations about permanence

After intervention, recommends either rehabilitation or adoption.


Video Interaction Guidance

- Video Interaction Guidance is an intervention which aims to enhance communication within relationships.
- VIG was developed in the Netherlands in the 1980s and brought to the UK by Hilary Kennedy at Dundee University
- The NSPCC has used the VIG programme in various settings and as part of various interventions.

- Parents Under Pressure aims to support parents who are on a drug or alcohol treatment program.

- Getting parents the right help and support as early as possible is crucial in helping them to develop secure and healthy relationships with their children.


